Each year we have organized a reading incentive program. This year we are having a "Reading and Writing Celebration" with a focus on writing as well as reading. As part of this year's incentive program, we are bringing Cynthia DeFelice, an award winning author and storyteller, to ECS. Ms. DeFelice will be coming to ECS to speak to us about her books along with the thrills and challenges of being an author.

We are expecting each student to read at least one book. After reading the book, the students will fill in a basic book report form. There will be different forms for fiction and nonfiction books. We will have one set of forms for primary students and different set for intermediate students. For the first book/book

report, the student will receive a *Smencil* pencil. Any additional books read/book report forms filled out will earn a ticket for the February drawings. (Prizes include baskets of writing materials, signed copies of Cynthia DeFelice's books, possibly special lunches with teachers)
